About this course

As burn professionals, we often encounter patients who lack motivation, resist rehabilitation, or become overly dependent on their caregivers. These challenges can be frustrating, but they are rarely a matter of personality. More often, they stem from the psychological impact of burn trauma and the emotional coping mechanisms of patients and caregivers alike.

This course will help you identify the psychosocial roots of these common clinical challenges and equip you with empathetic, evidence-based strategies to address them effectively:

- Understand the psychosocial impact of burns and how it contributes to emotional distress, reduced motivation, and compliance challenges.
- Develop empowering therapeutic approaches to support patients and caregivers.
- Apply a holistic approach to burn recovery by identifying complex emotions and psychological reactions in patients and families.

Family factors that affect post-burn rehabilitation

- Important role of caregiver
- Dynamic between caregiver and patient
- Communication between caregiver and patient
- Psychological self-care of the caregiver
